Dear Community Member:

Two alleys in the Oak Hill neighborhood have been identified for reconstruction in 2027 – see map on reverse for locations.

Reconstruction includes removal of the old surface, addressing drainage where possible and placement of a new concrete surface.

This work is part of the citywide alley reconstruction program approved by the city council in 2016, which aims to replace all gravel and bituminous alleys with concrete.

The project will be paid for using city funds; there will be no special assessments to property owners for this project.

Project development timeline is presented below and starts with data collection scheduled to begin this spring.

1. Data collection

As spring progresses, you may notice survey crews, soil boring equipment and other workers performing inspections, marking utilities and collecting data in your neighborhood. The collected information will help in preparing preliminary designs that will establish the design of the new alley.

2. Public engagement

No improvements or construction in the area will occur until there has been an opportunity for public input on the project. That process starts later in the year when you are invited to a neighborhood meeting with city staff to discuss the project scope and review preliminary plans. This is the time to get involved and talk with city staff about the planned project.

3. Council decision

In early 2027, the city council will vote to authorize the project based on feedback received.

4. Construction: Spring—Summer 2027
