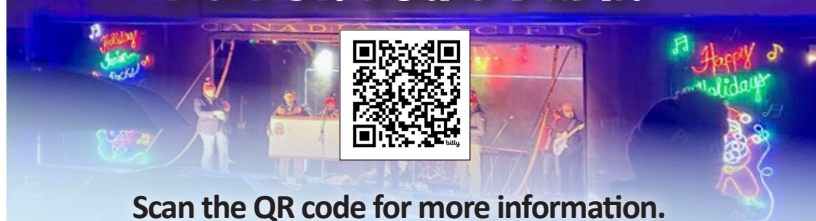

Keep waterways clear

Leaves and other debris that get into storm drains pollute waterways and negatively impact the health of local plants and wildlife. They can also cause flooding. Here's how to help:

Keep streets clear for street sweepers.

All city streets are swept at least twice a year – in the spring and fall. Fall street sweeping starts in early October and continues until the snow falls. Avoid parking on streets during daytime hours.

Don't rake leaves or blow grass clippings into the street.

What level do you register for?

If you are not sure what level to register your child for, register them as follows:

- Skaters who are ages 4 – 6, who have little or no skating experience, sign up for Beginner Snowplow.
- Skaters who are age 7 and older, who have little or no skating experience, sign up for Basic 1/Pre-Alpha.

Session registration deadlines and class exception

In order to staff and add classes as needed, deadline to register for classes is two weeks prior to the start of the session. Add your name to the waitlist if a class is full. Skaters registered for the prior session will be given priority in placement.

Special notes

- Fee includes skate rental, ISI weSKATE membership, practice ice (if available) and three free open skate passes.
- Protective headgear is required for all Snowplow skaters and highly recommended for all lower-level skaters. Bicycle or lightweight hockey helmets are acceptable.
- Skaters should wear warm, comfortable clothing, including gloves or mittens.
- First-time skaters and those using rental skates should arrive 15 minutes before the start of class to be ready when class begins.
- Skaters may be moved at instructor discretion throughout the session to a level that is appropriate for them.
- Students may remain in the same level for a few sessions before mastering the skills needed to move up to the next level. Skaters that desire to progress more quickly are encouraged to register for two classes a week.
- Class assignments are not guaranteed. Classes may be combined or canceled if minimum number has not been met.

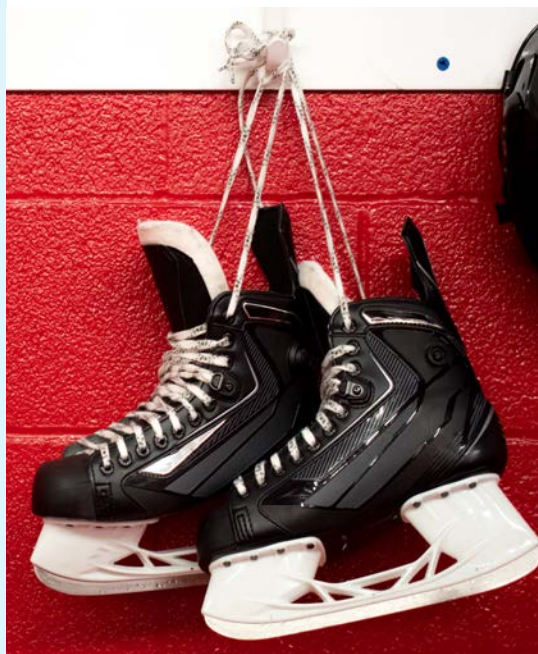

How it works
